## POWERPOINT BRIEFING INITIATIVE ON VISION

## DESCRIPTION

The PowerPoint Briefing is the second part of the strategic leadership policy initiative. The first part was the design of a visionary graphic representation.

The PowerPoint Briefing, in conjunction with the 1) graphic representation of the vision and 2) final policy paper, determines the final grade.

## **INSTRUCTIONS**

Each student or group will design an educational vision or educational strategy and present that vision as a policy briefing. The policy briefing for this leadership project will be presented in two parts: 1) a PowerPoint presentation with 5-6 slides and 2) a double-spaced paper limited to five pages.

An example of a PowerPoint Briefing can be found on the CEPA site. Use the graphic representation of your vision, which you created earlier, as the focal point of your PowerPoint presentation. Refer to a "Graphic Model" in CEPA site under the Leadership Button for an example of a powerpoint briefing:

The graphic representation of your vision should be included after the introductory slide. Then follow with the goals and objectives of your presentation, the impact statements and summary slide. Remember, the visionary graphic representation was just that—a picture of your vision. The PowerPoint Briefing is your chance to include the details about your vision. Look at this as an opportunity to educate others about the changes you envision.

The last step, described in the "Strategic Paper" assignment, is to develop a leadership policy paper based on the visionary graphic representation and PowerPoint Briefing.
