Keynote Speaker

Dr. Frank Mayadas

Program Director, Alfred P. Sloan Foundation

Frank Mayadas has a Ph.D. in Applied Physics from Cornell in 1965 and a B.S. from the Colorado School of Mines in 1961. He started the Sloan online learning program in 1993 and his work in online education, globalization of industry and in the development of the U.S. Army's online education program (eARMYU) is nationally recognized. Prior to his work at the Sloan Foundation, Dr. Frank Mayadas spent 27 years at IBM. He has over 35 published papers in systems, devices, and solid state physics and holds several patents and awards.

Luncheon Speaker

Cabinet Secretary John M. Garcia

Department of Veterans' Services, State of New Mexico

John Garcia was appointed in 2003 as the first Cabinet Secretary of the New Mexico Department of Veterans Services. He is a founding member of the Vietnam Veterans of New Mexico, served as the National Deputy Director of the Vietnam Veterans Leadership Program from 1983–1985, was involved in the dedication of the National Vietnam Veterans' Memorial in Washington, DC, directed the Vietnam Veterans of New Mexico Program, and served as a Commissioner of the New Mexico Veterans' Service Commission for twelve years. Mr. Garcia attended the University of Albuquerque and the Chamber Institute at Stanford University and served in the Central Highland of South Viet Nam from 1969–1970.

Opening Session Remarks

Major General Kenny C. Montoya The Adjutant General, Departments of the Army and Air Force State of New Mexico

Major General Kenny C. Montoya assumed the duties as Adjutant General for the New Mexico National Guard in 2003 commanding the Army and Air National Guard, as well as serving as the commander of the State Defense Force. In addition to his federal duties, he serves as military chief of staff to the Governor and as the Governor's principal advisor on military affairs. He is also president of the State Armory Board and provides oversight for the New Mexico Civil Air Patrol. He has a law degree from the University of New Mexico, a Masters of Laws from the Judge Advocate General School, and a Masters in Strategic Studies from the US Army War School.

COL John G. Rossi

Deputy Commanding General and Chief of Staff U.S. Army Air Defense Artillery Center and Fort Bliss

COL John G. Rossi has a BS from the United States Military Academy, an MA in Management from Webster University, and an MA in National Strategic Studies from the U.S. Naval War College. He is a graduate of the US Army Command and General Staff College and a distinguished graduate of the US Naval War College. He has served in various worldwide operational assignments commanding levels from platoon through brigade.

General Dwight David Eisenhower wrote that the qualities of a great person are "Vision, integrity, courage, understanding, the power of articulation, and profundity of character."

He believed that the qualities of goodness in a person include a broad sympathy for the human condition; an awareness of human weaknesses and shortcomings and a willingness to forgive them, a sense of responsibility toward others, a genuine modesty combined with a justified self-confidence, a sense of humor, and most of all a love of life and of people.
