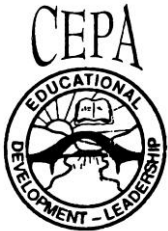

Hence, CEPA was developed in 1995 in response to the urgent need for a different approach for improving leadership. It is an innovative and bold leadership initiative with an emphasis on developing future leaders through collaborative arrangements and

The primary thrust of CEPA has been the involvement of doctoral students from all fields of education, administration, community affairs, business and the social sciences, who believe that, in a rapidly changing world, all knowledge is integrated and opportunities must be provided to exchange ideas and information from all fields. CEPA addresses critical educational and social issues through the use of seminars, forums, and conferences in which small interdisciplinary

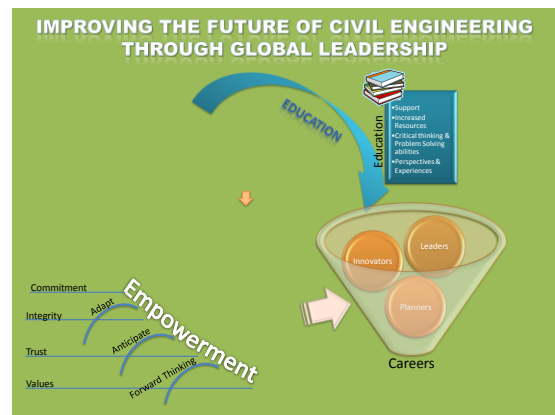
